We're closing out the school year with fun lessons on birds and insects.

We are made a bee craft using toilet paper rolls, a moveable bird papercraft, and are feather painting with watercolors.

We have been going on daily bug hunts and finding very interesting things like different types of cicadas and a large leaf-footed bug. This month we are also introducing a bird scavenger hunt where the children are to find large laminated cards hidden in our environment with a clipboard to keep track of their progress.

Dear Re'ut families,

Wow! After publishing our first bilingual, Hebrew and English Haggada, we came back from Pesach break, eager to learn more.

In Hebrew, we are reviewing our Alef Bet books and going on to blend letters with nekudot. It's fun to see our friends recognize a Hebrew word and see how it is spelled.

In Language Arts, each child has their individualized decoding plan as they sound out letters, blend words and read our Bob books.

We have Montessori 3 part cards for nomenclature with labels and pictures. We are completing our land and bodies of water, science unit. It's cool to see them say the words island, cape and archipelago with ease. We are using hand eye coordination to practice handwriting.

In math, we mark our calendar daily and we are counting the Omer to receive the Torah, by days and weeks. We are using our number boards and will be expanding to teen numbers with bead work.

For June, we have a beautiful bird unit planned and a weather pin punching wheel. Learning about the water cycle, especially when we can see it outside our classroom window, gives us a better understanding of nature.
